NON-PARTISAN VOLUNTEERS READY TO HELP VOTERS ON TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 4

WHAT: The Committee of Seventy has recruited and trained 150 non-partisan volunteers to

Background: The Committee of Seventy conducts the nation's oldest non-partisan local Election Day program. Trained volunteers assist voters throughout the year by responding to questions about the



voting process and candidates on the ballot. In addition, during every primary and general election day for the last 110 years, Seventy sends non-partisan volunteers to Philadelphia polling places to help voters. Significant features of Seventy's program for the November 4 general election include:

- A **highly structured operation** designed to ensure that questions, concerns, or problems at polling places in Philadelphia are answered and handled promptly and efficiently. The polls are open from 7 a.m. until 8 p.m.
- **NEW 1-855-SEVENTY (1-855-738-3689) Hotline** for voters in Philadelphia to report problems at the polls. Volunteers or law enforcement representatives, if needed, will be dispatched to resolve issues called into the hotline. **Representatives of the media are urged to disseminate the hotline number.**
- Representatives from the City Commissioners and District Attorney's office will be stationed
 in Seventy's office to handle any serious problems throughout the day.
